



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# Club Distance Chart

Use this Club Distance Chart to help gauge your progress and save strokes on the course. Knowing the exact distance you hit your clubs not only enhances your confidence but also replaces guessing with real numbers. This is especially helpful in determining club choice quickly and easily on the course. Knowing your distances is also useful when evaluating your club inventory. When considering adding or replacing a club in your set, knowing the actual distance you hit each club is crucial in choosing the club that will most benefit your game. Why carry two clubs that hit the same distance if you really only need to fill in a distance gap?

The long first will play as a three-shot hole for most. The tee shot plays downhill to a fairway that slopes left-to-right. Drives missing the fairway right will find a row of pines, likely requiring a pitch out back to the fairway. A good layup will leave a short-iron approach between 75-100 yards to a small green guarded by two bunkers short. The putting surface slopes backleft to front-right.

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PAR 4 HANDICAP 8/8

A drive down the middle is ideal, avoiding a lone bunker and scattered trees left. A good drive leaves a slightly uphill approach between 110-140 yards to a deceptive, small green guarded by two bunkers short. The putting surface slopes back-left to front-right. Missing long will leave you struggling to save par.

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PAR 5 HANDICAP 5/5

**●**554 **●**474 **●**451



The long, uphill second plays as a half-par hole, yielding as many bogeys as it will pars. A drive right-of-center is ideal, avoiding pines left and right. A good drive leaves a semi-blind, uphill approach between 150-180 yards to a large, flat green guarded by a bunker and steep slopes left. When the pin is left, play to the middle of the green.

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#### **SEVENTEEN**





PAR 3 HANDICAP 16/16

○170 **●**160 **●**135



This short hole plays uphill to a large green guarded by a sand right and a grass bunker left. The putting surface is two-tiered and slopes considerably back-left to front-right. Staying below the hole is key to scoring well around this green.

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PAR 4 HANDICAP 1/1

The long third plays back down the hill to a fairway guarded by a hazard and woods right. A solid drive leaves an uphill approach between 150-175 yards to a green guarded by a false front and two large bunkers. The putting surface is deep, narrow, and slopes primarily left-to-right. Par is an excellent score.

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#### SIXTEEN





PAR 4 HANDICAP 10/12

○320 **●**285 **●**273



The short sixteenth requires a drive played right-of-center as the fairway slopes significantly right-to-left. Drives missing the fairway right or left will likely be blocked out by large trees. A good drive will leave a semi-blind, uphill approach between 60-100 yards to a green guarded by a bunker and falloff left. The putting surface slopes front-right to back-left. The safe miss is short right.

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#### **THREE**





PAR 4 HANDICAP 3/3

This short hole plays downhill to a teardropshaped green flanked by mounding and two bunkers. The putting surface is relatively flat. When the pin is cut in the front, play to the middle of the green.

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
**FIFTEEN** 



The beautiful fifteenth is a reachable par-five that favors a drive right-of-center, avoiding woods right and scattered trees left. Longer hitters will be left with a semi-blind second between 175-200 yards to a green protected by mounding right and a deep bunker left. Shorter hitters should play their secondshots to a plateau short-right of the green, leaving an approach between 40-75 yards. The green is deep, but narrow, and slopes primarily back-right to front-left.

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#### **FOUR**





PAR 3 HANDICAP 17/17

**●194 ●148 ●139** 



The short fifth is a great risk / reward hole that offers two options off the tee. Longer hitters can go for the green (275 yards on a direct line), but must carry mature pines left of the fairway. The conservative option requires a shot between 180-200 yards, avoiding woods right. A good drive leaves a blind, uphill approach of approximately 75 yards to a green guarded by two bunkers short. The putting surface is large and slopes slightly left-to-right.

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#### **FOURTEEN**





PAR 4 HANDICAP 12/14



The short fourteenth is a great risk / reward hole that offers two options off the tee. Longer hitters can go for the green (275 yards on a direct line), but must carry mature pines left of the fairway. The conservative option requires a shot between 180-200 yards, avoiding woods right. A good drive leaves a blind, uphill approach of approximately 75 yards to a green guarded by two bunkers short. The putting surface is large and slopes slightly left-to-right.

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PAR 4 HANDICAP 11/13



The beautiful sixth is a reachable par-five that favors a drive right-of-center, avoiding woods right and scattered trees left. Longer hitters will be left with a semi-blind second between 175-200 yards to a green protected by mounding right and a deep bunker left. Shorter hitters should play their secondshots to a plateau short-right of the green, leaving an approach between 40-75 yards. The green is deep, but narrow, and slopes primarily back-right to front-left.

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#### **THIRTEEN**





PAR 3 HANDICAP 18/18

○186 **●**148 **●**139



This short hole plays downhill to a teardropshaped green flanked by mounding and two bunkers. The putting surface is relatively flat. When the pin is cut in the front, play to the middle of the green.

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### **Hole Seven**

The short seventh requires a drive played rightof-center as the fairway slopes significantly rightto-left. Drives missing the fairway right or left will likely be blocked out by large trees. A good drive will leave a semi-blind, uphill approach between 60-100 yards to a green guarded by a bunker and falloff left. The putting surface slopes front-right to back-left. The safe miss is short right.

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#### **TWELVE**





PAR 4 HANDICAP 4/4

The long twelfth plays back down the hill to a fairway guarded by a hazard and woods right. A solid drive leaves an uphill approach between 150-175 yards to a green guarded by a false front and two large bunkers. The putting surface is deep, narrow, and slopes primarily left-to-right. Par is an excellent score.

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#### **SEVEN**





PAR 4 HANDICAP 9/11

•340 •285 •273



This short hole plays uphill to a large green guarded by a sand right and a grass bunker left. The putting surface is two-tiered and slopes considerably back-left to front-right. Staying below the hole is key to scoring well around this green.

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#### **ELEVEN**





PAR 4 HANDICAP 2/2

**0419 •401 •401** 



The long, uphill eleventh plays as a half-par hole, yielding as many bogeys as it will pars. A drive right-of-center is ideal, avoiding pines left and right. A good drive leaves a semi-blind, uphill approach between 150-180 yards to a large, flat green guarded by a bunker and steep slopes left. When the pin is left, play to the middle of the green.

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PAR 3 HANDICAP 15/15

**●188 ●160 ●135** 



A drive down the middle is ideal, avoiding a lone bunker and scattered trees left. A good drive leaves a slightly uphill approach between 110-140 yards to a deceptive, small green guarded by two bunkers short. The putting surface slopes back-left to front-right. Missing long will leave you struggling to save par.

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PAR 5 HANDICAP 6/6

○**481 ●474 ●451** 



This long hole will play as a three-shot hole for most. The tee shot plays downhill to a fairway that slopes left-to-right. Drives missing the fairway right will find a row of pines, likely requiring a pitch out back to the fairway. A good layup will leave a short-iron approach between 75-100 yards to a small green guarded by two bunkers short. The putting surface slopes backleft to front-right.
